One day I asked him what he would do if he won \$10 million dollars. His answer: "Give it to the homeless. I have everything I need." So now, once every month or two we go to the dollar store and buy items to put in a "survival sack" to pass out to the homeless. We do other fun things too, like hang out at our house and play games, go out to eat, play laser tag and arcade games, and have conversations about important things. He is my buddy and I am thankful to God for bringing him into my life.



What is mentoring?

Mentoring, at its core, guarantees young people that there is someone who cares about them, assures them they are not alone in dealing with day-today challenges, and makes them feel like thev matter. Research confirms that quality mentoring relationships have powerful positive effects on young people in a variety of personal, academic, and professional situations. Ultimately, mentoring connects a young person to personal growth and development, and social and economic opportunity. Yet one in three young people will grow up without this critical asset.


Kids Update
