"Let's go to my place. Tasha can't stop us from studying the Bible there!" --Afghan refugee woman about missionary Tasha Hayes

For some years now, there has been a very slow but very steady growing interest in the Gospel among the refugee women. The women on our team have been very lovingly, patiently, and faithfully investing in these precious seekers in so many different ways: listening to their problems, crying with them, taking them on outings, loving their children, visiting them in their "homes", inviting them into their homes, going to the hospitals and police stations, praying with them, leading Bible studies, answering phone calls, and developing deep relationships of loving friendships.

A few refugees along the way have indicated faith in Jesus, some publicly and some privately. Some have moved on and some are still here.

Currently there is a good group of women who are very committed to regular Bible study and indicating serious interest in turning to Jesus. At the Bible study in our ministry center last week with teammates Lisa Dirrim and Tasha Hayes, Tasha was not feeling well to begin with, and after a LONG time of focus on Matthew 22 and Galatians 2:20, there erupted a very emotional outburst of statements and questions indicating a deep passion for God's truth in His word. Several started heatedly saying how wrong it was that they were forbidden to read the Bible in Afghanistan.

However, Tasha was feeling worse and worse (physically), so after some hours finally said, "Ladies, we really need to stop for today." To which one of the ladies responded, "Let's go to my place. TASHA CAN'T STOP US FROM STUDYING THE BIBLE THERE!" :)

Thanks for praying that these women who are "on the edge" would overcome their (legitimate) fears, and take that step forward in following Jesus.
