Christmas is long past, but we can't help but tell you about it, even now. This Christmas, our primary outreaches took place at three Christmas parties designed for families and children. On two nights running, we invited 500 children and parents to enjoy a cooked meal, live entertainment, and a family photo in front of the Christmas tree. As they left, each received a gift-something small for the parents and an overflowing backpack for every child.

Then, on the Saturday before Christmas, we made the ARC into a Christmas Toy Village for children. Each child was given a ticket that entitled them to "buy" toys in heaped toy rooms and grab some yummy hot chocolate and cakes in the "café" run by local school children. They were also able, in other corners of the hall, to have their faces painted, make cards for family and friends, decorate cookies and choose nice children's clothes. It was a party and a half!

But we saw in the comments of a few refugees that there was something to these parties beyond giving people a little joy and a few toys.

Sali commented, just before he left the party with his wife and child, "I pray to God that He will help me understand Jesus, because I have seen love in these people here."

Then it was Mr. Gul, still a Muslim, with his five children and wife, who said, "We do not come here anymore for the food. We have food on our table every day now. We come because we are treated as friends."

And last was the comment of a young Afghani man, who spoke (positively) of the ARC as, "that place of Jesus."

The true success of these parties was not the temporary happiness or the toys we gave to people. The heart of these parties was Jesus. He was there, and the people sensed it. They knew in their hearts what they couldn't yet understand in their minds, that Emmanuel was among us at the ARC this Christmas. And they felt welcomed and loved in His presence.

Thank you to those of you who gave towards our Christmas outreaches. Your donations helped make these parties a joyful memory for so many refugees, and gave opportunity for the Truth of Jesus to be proclaimed yet again among Muslims in Athens.
