


Give Christmas to a Refugee!

Athens, Greece.

Here on the other side of the world, we are already beginning to think about the other end of the calendar—Christmas. Most of our refugee friends come from Muslim countries that never celebrate the birth of Christ, people like Azar and Fatima from Iran, who have sacrificed much in pursuit of a dream of a new life in some place like London or Paris. While they are still here in Athens, we would like to make their first Christmas a special time of feasting and gift-giving, including a presentation of the best gift of all—the message of true life in Christ.

We on the Athens refugee team can't think of a better way to share God's love with the refugees than by offering them meals and gifts that meet both physical and spiritual needs. We want to give up to 500 Kurdish and Farsi speakers a special evening for each language group with a Gospel presentation, a special Christmas meal, and practical gifts like a backpack, towel, and Christian literature in their own languages. This is a God-sized dream—we need \$5000 to make all of this happen.
